fifty years after the liberation of the concentration camps this memoir by lucie adelsberger a jewish female physician shipped to auschwitz and put to work in the infirmary of the infamous death camp s gypsy section serves as a haunting reminder of the horrors perpetrated by the nazi regime in this memoir adelsberger vividly describes the hell that was auschwitz uniquely capturing the ordeals suffered by women who were especially vulnerable once they reached the camps throughout her moving memoir adelsberger depicts the methods the nazis used to degrade and dehumanize jews and other holocaust victims robbing them of their dignity their freedom and oftentimes their lives her poignant testament to the human suffering and the human spirit at auschwitz will stir readers deeply

we felt an urge to document what we had witnessed if we who had experienced it i reasoned did not reveal the bitter truth people

simply would not believe the extent of the nazis evil i wanted to share our life the events and our struggle to survive

a history of the holocaust is a detailed factual account of what happened across europe during the holocaust with balanced coverage of each country the holocaust was unique within the context of the second world war because jews were disproportionately represented among the civilian casualties in that conflict over fifty million people died as a result of the application of total war twelve per cent of these were jews at the time jews constituted less than one quarter of one per cent of the world s population this book is intended as a textbook not a philosophical interpretation of the holocaust written in a highly accessible style it is addressed to students and will inspire them to read more about the subject and to question the problems of the world
