helmut ortner reveals a staggering history of perpetrators victims and bystanders in hitler s germany he explores the shocking evidence of a merciless era and of the shameful omissions of post war german justice johann reichhart was a state appointed judicial executioner in bavaria from 1924 until the end of the war in europe during the nazi era he executed numerous people who were sentenced to death for resisting national socialism including many of those involved in the 20 july 1944 bomb plot on adolf hitler as a member of the ss totenkopfverb nde the ss organisation responsible for administering the concentration and extermination camps arnold strippel served at a number of locations during his rise to the rank of ss obersturmführer these included natzweiler struthof buchenwald majdanek ravensbrück and neuengamme where he was responsible for murdering the victims of a series of tuberculosis medical experiments like

reichhart erich schwinge was also involved in the legal sphere during the third reich a german military lawyer in 1931 he became a professor of law and from 1936 wrote the legal commentary on german military criminal law that was decisive during the nazi era aside from the part they played in hitler s regime these three men all had one further thing in common they survived the war and restarted their careers in adenauer s federal republic of germany in hitler s henchmen helmut ortner uncovers the full stories of reichhart strippel schwinge and others like them nazi perpetrators who enjoyed post war careers as judges university professors doctors and politicians had they been gutless cogs in the machinery of the nazi state or ideologized persecutors ortner reveals that it was not only their nazi pasts that were forgotten but how the suffering of the victims including resistance fighters such as georg elser and maurice becaud and their relatives was suppressed and ignored

blaine taylor has written and assembled a fascinating photographic history of adolf hitler s many headquarters both before and during world war ii taylor includes all of the private

residences offices command posts and even mobile headquarters from which the nazi dictator planned his rise to power and the conquest of europe taylor recounts the background and physical description of each headquarters while also relating these locations importance to the larger story of nazi germany and world war ii restless hitler rarely worked at a desk and was almost always on the move during the war with headquarters scattered throughout germany and across the continent from the ukraine to belgium taylor describes the best known headquarters such as wolf s lair the berchtesgaden complex and the berlin bunker but he also includes many lesser known ones such as hitler s armored train amerika felsennest near the belgian border and the compound codenamed tannenberg in the black forest hitler spent a fortune on these varied sites some of which he never used ultimately and perhaps fittingly he spent his final days before committing suicide holed up in his extensive bunker deep beneath berlin

the first biography in english of a leading dutch american physicist who discovered the subatomic property of spin and spearheaded the search for hitler s atom bomb as world war ii came to an end this engaging biography of an important dutch physicist brings to light his significant scientific contributions and remarkable life story based on recently released archives and material from goudsmit s daughter esther science journalist martijn van calmthout has reconstructed a life marked by both brilliance and tragedy as a young man sam goudsmit came to international attention when he and a colleague published a seminal paper that introduced the property of electron spin into atomic theory this discovery helped to remove remaining questions about atomic theory and brought him into contact with the likes of einstein heisenberg and other leading physicists of the early 20th century in 1927 he was offered a position at the university of michigan and moved with his wife to the united states when the nazis invaded the netherlands goudsmit a jew feared for the lives of his parents and other family members still in holland his attempts to get his german colleague werner heisenberg to intervene on their behalf proved fruitless toward the end of world war ii he was recruited by the department of defense as the scientific leader of the co called alsos mission whose task was to search for evidence of german atom bomb development the team eventually found stores of uranium ore and a nuclear reactor among other evidence while in europe goudsmit had an opportunity to return to the hague his hometown there in the

rubble of his parent s house he discovered that they had been deported to auschwitz after the war he returned to the united states and became the editor of physical review and physical review letters the latter is a leading physics journal to this day but guilt over his failure to save his parents haunted him for the rest of his life this is a biography that in part reads like a thriller and restores long overdue recognition to an important 20th century physicist
